The 35th meeting of the Physiotherapy Board of Australia (the National Board) was held 19 October 2012 at the Perth AHPRA office.

New members

The National Board elected Ms Philippa (Pippa) Tessmann as the Deputy Chair of the Physiotherapy Board of Australia for a term of three years.

Five members of the National Board were appointed to the Continuous Improvement Committee. This committee will concentrate on working up recommendations of strategic importance for the consideration of the National Board.

Consultation paper

The Board has released a consultation paper on the review of the accreditation function for the Physiotherapy Board of Australia. An identical review is being conducted by the other 9 professions which commenced in the National Scheme on 1 July 2010.

Registration renewal information

On behalf of the National Board, AHPRA has commenced its registration renewal campaign for physiotherapists. Renewal of registration is required by **30 November 2012**.

Annual Report

AHPRA and the National Boards submitted the 2012 Annual Report to Ministers by 30 September as required by the National Law. The report, expected to be publicly released on 1 November, details the work of the National Boards and AHPRA in implementing the second year of the National Registration and Accreditation Scheme. The release will be supported by the publication of a special edition of AHPRA Report. The 2012 Annual Report and AHPRA Report will both be published on online.
