

Decision-making bodies of the Medical Board of Australia

Under section 36 of the National Law, National Boards can establish a State, Territory or Regional Board for a participating jurisdiction to enable the Board to exercise its functions in the jurisdiction in a way that provides an effective and timely local response to health practitioners and other persons in the jurisdiction.

Additionally, under section 37, National Boards have the power to delegate decision-making functions.
