Response from Australian and New Zealand Academy of Endodontists, Inc.

In principal, The Academy supports stringent international checks for overseas dentists intending to reside and practice in Australia.

Potential applicants should be subject to at least the same degree of scrutiny as local dentists when it comes to checking of criminal records.

In this regard, Option 5 seems a reasonable approach, with an independent international scrutineer checking applicants.

The cost should be borne by the applicant.

The scrutineer would need to be assessed from time to time to ensure that there is no corruption of the process.

Therefore the Academy supports Option 5, as long as this is also the preferred option of the Australia Dental Association, with whom we are affiliated.

If the ADA has a differing view, then we would support their view.

With regard to the Feedback you have requested.
