

Communiqué

The 64th meeting of the Physiotherapy Board of Australia (the Board) was held on 31 July 2015 at the National Office of the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA) in Melbourne.

This communiqué outlines the issues and decisions from this meeting, and other points of interest.

Initial considerations for physiotherapy prescribing

The Board considered a submission from the Australian Physiotherapy Association (APA) regarding physiotherapist prescribing in Australia. It acknowledges the work done by the APA in developing an initial case for prescribing and looks forward to continuing to explore this important potential development with the APA and other key stakeholders.

The Board must carefully consider the evidence and issues raised by any proposal for regulatory change before a submission can go before Health Ministers to approve the Board's endorsement of a physiotherapist's registration to prescribe scheduled medicines. This process may take a significant period of time and, among other things, will require the Board to consult widely with a range of key stakeholders, including physiotherapists and the general public.

Expressions of interest to join the Registration and Notifications Committee

The Board has decided to refresh the membership of its National Registration and Notifications Committee (RNC). The RNC has duties delegated to it by the Board to consider notifications (complaints) made about physiotherapists. An Expression of Interest process will be advertised on the Board's website in the coming weeks.

Medicines Australia

Medicines Australia has updated its *Code of conduct*. From 1 October 2015, member pharmaceutical companies will be required to publicly report payments by companies to healthcare professionals for the provisions of services and where support is provided for education.
